Some time ago, I was invited to be a counsellor at a voung people's camp. I don't know how many of you people out there reading this book are Roman Catholics, but that old Roman Catholic theology is right: there is a purgatory. It is young people's camp - a place between heaven and hell where people go to suffer for their sins.

I have never met meaner kids in my life than at this camp. Don't get me wrong. I love young people individually, but the gang at this young people's camp were really bad. Something must happen to young people in a group at camp. They get mean. Let me tell you, these young people at this camp turned really mean. Their meanness was focused on an unfortunate kid named Billy. Billy really broke my heart because he had been born with a whole host of birth defects. He had cerebral palsy and his brain was unable to exercise proper control over the movements of his body or his speech. The other kids mocked him. They called him 'spastic.' Billy would walk across the grounds of the camp in his disjointed manner, and the others would line up behind him, imitating him and mimicking his every movement. They thought that this was funny. It was the worst kind of young people's cruelty I had ever seen.

One day I watched as Billy asked one of the boys a question, 'Which way is the craft shop?' The other boy twisted up grotesquely, pointed a dozen different ways and said, 'That way!' I felt like punching out that mean kid. How could he be so cruel to a handicapped boy?

The level of meanness reached its lowest point on a Wednesday niorning. Billy's dormitory had been assigned the morning devotions for that camp of 150 kids. All of the boys in his dormitory had voted for

Billy to be the speaker. I knew, and they knew, that he couldn't do it; they just wanted to get him up there so that they could mock him and laugh. They thought it would be fun to watch 'spastic Billy' try to deliver a devotional talk. I was irate. And I was livid. I was seething with anger as little Billy got up out of his seat and limped his way to the platform. You could hear the titters of mocking laughter and sneering going through the group. I could not remember ever being so angry. What was amazing was that the ridicule of the boys didn't stop that boy. He took his place behind the rostrum and started to speak. It took Billy almost ten tortured minutes to say, 'Je-sus loves meee! Je-Je-Je-sus loves meee! Annd-I-I-love Je-JeJesus.' And when he finished there was dead silence. I looked over my shoulder, and there were boys shaking and trembling and crying all over the place.

A revival broke out in that camp and young people turned their lives over to Jesus. A host of boys committed their lives to Christian service. I wish I had kept count of how many ministers I have met as I travel across the USA who have told me that they gave their lives to Jesus because of the witness of a 'spastic' kid named Billy.

If God could use him with all of his limitations, what makes you think that God can't use you to touch the lives of other people? If God can transform the lives of people through the likes of little Billy, don't you dare tell me He can't do great things through you.

Something s wrong in the town, but why? Behind the scenes the book reveals the heavenly battle for the future od Ashton, and the world. The human characters Hank, Marshall. Berniece and others act out the battle on one plane, whilst around them but unseen Tal, Krioni and other angels prepare for war with Rafar. Lucius and other demons.
I bought the book on Monday and read over half of it that evening. Its a long book (over 500 pages) but exciting and challenging.
